


Studies are carefully directed and closely monitored. Students are given a great deal of independence and expected to develop good autonomous study habits, which are essential to success.

Academic rigour is central to our curriculum.

Students are challenged by a curriculum that expects them to go deeper and beyond the National Curriculum. Subjects we offer are rigorous academic disciplines providing powerful knowledge and cultural capital for all students regardless of background.

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Student-centred

Our student-centred curriculum seeks to meet the needs of our diverse community.

This is about knowing, valuing and supporting our students as unique learners. For example, this is reflected in the support programme for students' options choices at KS4 and KS5.

Leadership and individual development opportunities are offered throughout the school as we seek to support our students to develop into compassionate, resilient and responsible young people. There are opportunities to help younger students with their learning as mentors and Aspire Champions and to get involved in music, drama and sporting activities both as participants and leaders.

Our Senior Student Leadership Team act as role models for younger students and we are proud of the spirit of collaboration and care which characterise our school community.

Holistic Education

Co-curricular activities are integral to a holistic education.

After school, English Martyrs' buzzes with activity, allowing students to be creative, perform, play sport and be active. We also provide extensive development pathways through aesthetic, creative, social, linguistic and literary, mathematical, sporting, scientific, spiritual and technological activities, as well as trips and residential experiences.

We understand that engagement in the Performing Arts helps students to develop self-confidence – so important in all spheres of life. To this end, everyone studies Art, Dance, Drama and Music. The school has a very active musical life and students are encouraged to join our Choir, the Schola Cantorum (Chamber Choir), the Orchestra and other ensembles which give several concerts every year and lead music for the school liturgies.

Our rich and varied sporting life allows students to play a number of team sports such as badminton, basketball, boys' and girls' football, dodgeball, hockey, cricket, netball, rounders, rugby and table tennis. Every student has a weekly Physical Education lesson, and additionally, through the options programme, some students take Sports Studies in Key Stage 4 and in the Sixth Form.

The Houses of the school compete against each other in a number of different sports, culminating in Sports Day, held each year in July at the Saffron Lane Stadium. Teams and individuals from English Martyrs' regularly take part in sporting competitions at regional and national level, frequently with great success.





The school is a cohesive and inclusive community in which pupils are respectful of each other. They are polite, courteous and conduct themselves around the school with maturity.
