
Each half term there will be a theme, which will either be Drop Everything and Read, Careers or PSHE. During Accelerate time.








WHAT OUR STUDENTS SAY ABOUT AVAILABLE PLACEMENTS:









All forms should be brought back in to school by the deadline given. These will then be given to LEBC

Students find out about their placements approx. 6 weeks before placement date

All paperwork should be signed and students will be starting their placement on the first day!

Students find their self-placements/select their sector choices

LEBC start to visit all placements for a H&S visit. LEBC start to source placements for application form students.

Students contact their employers for interview. Alternatively, those unplaced can choose an available placement.



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

 All contact will be through school. You will not hear from LEBC

All App forms are approved & signed by yourselves. Please make sure you have checked your YPs travel and sector choices.

- It is mandatory for students to arrange their interviews. This cannot be done by parents.
- LEBC will let the school know if we are struggling to get in touch with the SP employer. We may ask for more contact details.


- There are limitations to what your YP can do on work experience due to age.
- YPs will find out their placement once the paperwork comes in to school - approx. 6 weeks before.






