The year 11 course asks students to stop and look at the world around them, and then consider the right course of action. Many people in modern society do not see the value of religious perspectives. Some have come to see religious views as outdated or irrelevant. Others have even pointed the finger at religion itself as a major cause of abuse within marriage and of war. These units explore these truth claims, and the grounds beneath them.
