Theme of the Week Youth

Hear

See:

Mockery and Suffering: Jesus suffering on the cross while being mocked by rulers, soldiers, and one of the criminals.

The Two Thieves: two contrasting reactions to suffering: one criminal joins the mockery, while the other acknowledges his guilt and Jesus' innocence.

Jesus' Forgiveness: Jesus' compassion, even in his pain, as he responds with a promise of "Paradise" to the repentant thief.

Hear:

Accusations and Taunts: hear the accusations: "He saved others; let him save himself if he is God's Messiah, the Chosen One".

The Repentant Thief's Plea: hear the repentant thief's words: "Do you not even fear God... We indeed justly; for we receive the due reward of our deeds; but this Man has done nothing wrong" and his plea, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom".

Jesus' Promise: hear Jesus' direct promise: "Truly, I say to you, today you shall be with me in Paradise".

Think:

Redemption is Possible at Any Time: The story highlights that it's never too late to turn to God and ask for forgiveness, even in one's final moments.

True Kingship is Shown in Mercy: Jesus' power is not demonstrated by saving himself from the cross, but by offering boundless grace and mercy to the undeserving. This contrasts with the worldly ideas of power and strength.

Moral Choice Matters: The different responses of the two criminals show the power of personal choice and the importance of owning one's actions.

Forgiveness is Powerful: Forgiveness is a difficult but necessary step to move past ugliness and hurt, and it requires God's help.

Think

Do:

Practice Compassion and Forgiveness: strive to show love and forgiveness to others, even when it's difficult, modelling Jesus' example.

Acknowledge Wrongdoing: take responsibility for your mistakes, much like the repentant thief, rather than making excuses or blaming others.

Trust in God's Grace: learn to place your trust in Jesus, believing in his love and offer of salvation, regardless of your past.

Live as God's Representatives: make Jesus your "King each day, by doing what is right and good," and serving others, especially those in need.
