Day 1	A scene linked to prudence, e.g. Managing conflict: When a disagreement arises with a sibling or friend, prudence helps us use problem-solving skills rather than an emotional outburst. For example, they might suggest a fair compromise, like taking turns doing a chore.
Day 2	A challenging or contrasting image that shows another side of prudence Online and social behaviour: When faced with a friend's gossip, prudence helps us stay quiet rather than participating and spreading a rumour. They also think carefully before posting on social media, considering if they would be happy for their parents or future employers to see it.
Day 3	A hopeful or future-focused image connected to prudence
